

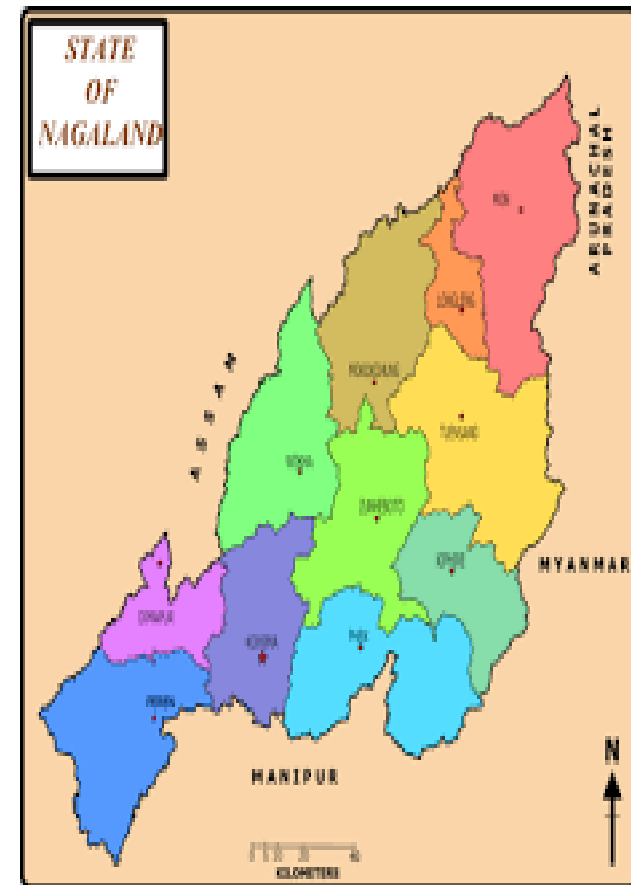

Overview

- Nagaland is one of the “seven sisters” of the North-East India.
- Nagaland is known for its myriad tribes with their rich culture and traditions.
- Emerged as a state, out of the Naga Hills district of Assam and NEFA province, 1963.
- It is bounded by Assam in the West, Myanmar on the east, Arunachal Pradesh and part of Assam on the north and Manipur in the south.

Skill gap analysis

- The State Industrial Policy, 2000, has identified sectors such as food processing, agro-forest based industries, tourism, sericulture, floriculture, handloom and handicraft, which have started to come up. These are the sectors which are based on State's natural endowments and traditional knowledge.
- Other identified sectors such as mineral based industries, bio-tech industries, electronics and IT and petrochemicals are yet to come up, mainly due to lack of private investment.

Skill Development Scenario

CRAFTSMEN TRAINING SCHEME (CTS)

- Number of Industrial Training Institutes = 8 (eight)
 - Number of trades = 21 (14 Engineering & 7 Non-Engineering).
 - Number of candidates trained till date - 7121
 - New ITIs at Peren & Dimapur District under construction.
 - Proposed to establish ITI at Kiphire & Longleng.

Department of Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship

- The nodal point of contact for skill development in the state of Nagaland is Department of Employment, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship.
- The Department is headed by a Director and a team of few people.
- Nagaland has been selected as representative north eastern state for FY2016-17 in National Skill Qualifications Committee (NSQC).

APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING SCHEME

- Apprenticeship Training to supplement the training in ITIs.
 - Number of candidates trained – 50
 - Number of candidates currently undergoing training - 16

Skill Development initiative SCHEME

- Skill Development Initiative Scheme to improve employability of school dropouts, existing workers, etc.
- 2 Job & Career Fairs held during 2013 and 2015
 - Number of candidates trained till date - 13796

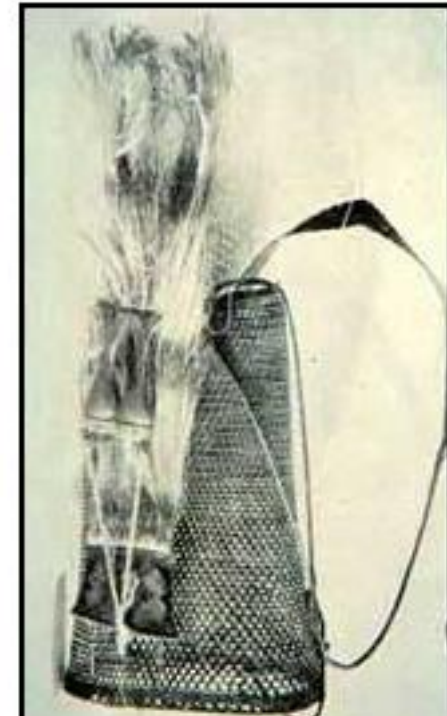

- The key elements of NSQF and filling up of QFs was shared with the state.
- Setting up of Core Committee on NSQF is in process
- State is also keen to come up with State Skill Policy

Plan of Activities for this year

- DoNER funded Job-linked skill training through the State Institute of Capacity Building (SICB), Sikkim for 100 youths of Nagaland.
- Job-linked skill training for 600 candidates through Capacity Building & Technical Assistance (CBTA) Project of DoNER.
- Coaching for Competitive Exams through NEC funding.
- Year of Construction Workers 2016 – 17 through State Government funding.
